## METHODOLOGY

This probabilistic survey was conducted September $28-29$, 2023, with 506 likely general election voters. It has a margin of error of $\pm 4.32 \%$. Known registered voters were interviewed via online panel and SMS. This survey was weighted to a likely general election voter universe.
